Libero, Playmaker & Striker wanted: BFFT opens transfer window with German Bundesliga Derby

Since yesterdays second Bundesliga game of Ingolstadt 04 against Munich TSV 1860, the transfer window has re-opened. While the exchange period in the German Bundesliga has been terminated some time ago, the Ingolstadt automotive engineering developer BFFT, continues looking to boost its team. Preconditions for this Football campaign, planned by the BFFT marketing and recruiting department, are promising: The Schanzer on top of the Second Ligue, the sold out Bavarian Derby as well as the many open positions at BFFT and the special activities at FCI provide an ideal starting point for this campaign.
